MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Marek A. Kwasnik appeals from the judgment of the Superior Court (Cumberland County, *Warren, J.*), pursuant to M.R. Civ. P. 80C, affirming an administrative order of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) certifying Kwasnik's failure to pay child support in accordance with a New Jersey court order to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Secretary of State and denying Kwasnik's request for a second administrative hearing to contest the findings of the New Jersey child support order. *See* 19-A M.R.S. §§ 2201(1), 2202(2) (2009). On appeal, Kwasnik presents a variety of challenges to DHHS's order, ranging from disputing findings made by various administrative agencies and courts to asserting constitutional violations in the efforts to enforce his child support payment obligations and restrict his capacity to get licenses from the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Secretary of State.

The issues regarding Kwasnik's challenges to DHHS's certification of his noncompliance with child support orders were addressed and resolved by us in *Kwasnik v. Department of Health & Human Services*, 2006 ME 27, 893 A.2d 610. The certifications at issue are authorized by 19-A M.R.S. §§ 2201, 2202. Kwasnik has demonstrated no impropriety in DHHS's actions or any change in

circumstances that would justify review by the Maine courts of orders of the New Jersey courts, which are entitled to full faith and credit, nor has Kwasnik asserted any factual error. He does not assert that he is in compliance, or has even attempted to achieve compliance, with his obligation to support his son.
