MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Bernard F. Kellish appeals from a judgment of the Superior Court (Penobscot County, *R. Murray, J.*) entered on a jury verdict convicting him of threatening display of a dangerous or deadly weapon (Class D), 25 M.R.S. §§ 2001-A(1)(A), 2004(2) (2010). Contrary to Kellish's contentions, viewing the evidence in the light most favorable to the State, there was evidence in the record from which the jury rationally could have found that the State proved each element of the offense beyond a reasonable doubt and disproved the justification of self-defense beyond a reasonable doubt. *See State v. Bickart*, 2009 ME 7, ¶ 46, 963 A.2d 183, 195 (noting standard of review); 17-A M.R.S. § 101(1) (2010) (stating that the State bears the burden to disprove self-defense when it is in issue).
