MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Suzanne Weinstock appeals from a judgment of the District Court (Waterville, *Oram, J.*) in which the court found that Weinstock had violated 29-A M.R.S. § 2073(3) (2010) by exceeding the speed limit by ten to fourteen miles per hour. Contrary to Weinstock's contentions, the court did not abuse its discretion in denying her a third continuance to seek evidence to rebut competent testimony from the investigating officer concerning his radar reading, nor did the court err regarding her discovery requests. *See* 29-A M.R.S. § 2075(4) (2010); M.R. Civ. P. 40(c), 80F(h); *Fox Isl. Granite Co. v. Am. Granite Mfrs., Inc.*, 2006 ME 14, ¶ 4, 890 A.2d 700; *Wellstone Partners v. J & M Constr. Co.*, 581 A.2d 789, 792 (Me. 1990).
