MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

The mother of Joel W. appeals from the judgment of the District Court (Dover-Foxcroft, *Stitham, J.*) terminating her parental rights to Joel pursuant to 22 M.R.S. § 4055(1)(B)(2) (2010). Joel was one of two children subject to the termination of parental rights proceeding. Termination of the mother's parental rights to her other child is not contested.

On appeal, the mother contends that the termination order was not supported by clear and convincing evidence in the record. The mother further contends that, with her parental rights to one child having been terminated, she may be better able to adequately parent the other child. However, nothing in the record supports that argument. The record before the court fully supports the court's findings, to the clear and convincing evidence standard, regarding parental unfitness and termination being in the best interest of the child. *See In re Adrian D.*, 2004 ME 144, ¶¶ 12-14, 861 A.2d 1286, 1290-91.
