MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Nellie B. Vick appeals from the judgment of the District Court (Dover-Foxcroft, Daigle, J.) addressing and deciding several motions to enforce and/or modify the parental rights provisions of the parties' divorce judgment. The principal effect of the order was to change primary residence for the parties' minor child from Nellie to Ronney L. Vick, with a very specific visitation schedule and limitations on Nellie's capacity to move the child out of state or out of the country. On appeal, Nellie contends that the court erred or abused its discretion by: (1) not acting in the best interest of the child; (2) making an order that was against the weight of the evidence; (3) discriminating against Nellie based on national origin; and (4) giving improper weight to some of the evidence related to change of circumstances. Review of the record in this case demonstrates that the findings and conclusions reached by the court to support the order subject to this appeal are fully supported by the evidence in the record. The record also reflects that, over a number of years, the judge assigned to this case has given it prompt and fair attention in the face of highly contentious litigation of the matter by both parties. The record further reflects that the judge engaged in no discriminatory acts and, instead, acted properly to preserve the jurisdiction and authority of the court in its decision on the order subject to this appeal.

Judgment affirmed. Remanded for hearing on pending motions. Mandate to issue immediately.
