MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Arthur M. Moran appeals from the judgment of the Superior Court (Penobscot County, *Cuddy, J.*) finding him guilty of criminal threatening with a dangerous weapon (Class C), 17-A M.R.S. §§ 209(1), 1252(4) (2011), following a jury trial. On appeal, Moran challenges certain of the credibility determinations reached by the jury and, asserting that the jury erred in its credibility determinations, concludes that there is insufficient evidence to support his conviction. The record demonstrates that there was more than sufficient evidence to support the jury's finding that Moran committed criminal threatening with a dangerous weapon against two individuals and that the credibility determinations were well within the province of the jury to make. *See State v. Medeiros*, 2010 ME 47, ¶ 16, 997 A.2d 95.
