MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Robert Cousins appeals from the judgment of the District Court (Calais, *Romei, J.*) ending his marriage to Beth Cousins. Contrary to Robert's contentions, the court did not err in its findings about the property within the marital estate or abuse its discretion in its equitable division of that property. *See* 19-A M.R.S. § 953 (2012); *Laqualia v. Laqualia*, 2011 ME 114, ¶ 13, 30 A.3d 838. To the extent that Robert argues that the court lacked sufficient information to find the value of the marital component of his premarital business, the court was entitled to determine that value with the information then in the record, *see Bond v. Bond*, 2011 ME 54, ¶ 14, 17 A.3d 1219, particularly in light of Robert's violation of the court's pretrial orders regarding discovery, filing a proposed judgment, and other matters.
