MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Katachi Clark appeals, and Isaac Landreth cross-appeals, from a judgment of the District Court (Augusta, *Fowle, J.*) modifying a parental rights and responsibilities order. *See* 19-A M.R.S. § 1657 (2014). Contrary to both parties' arguments, the court did not abuse its discretion in establishing a visitation framework intended to gradually and carefully reintroduce Landreth into their son's life. *See* 19-A M.R.S. § 1653(1)(C), (3) (2014); *Cloutier v. Lear*, 1997 ME 35, ¶ 8, 691 A.2d 660. Further, the process employed by the court did not violate the parties' due process rights, and the court did not abuse its discretion by questioning witnesses during the hearing. *See* M.R. Evid. 611, 614. Finally, any motion to enforce the order must be presented to the trial court, and the parties' remaining contentions are unpersuasive. *See* M.R. Civ. P. 60(a), 66, 120; 19-A M.R.S. § 103 (2014).
