MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Victoria Starr appeals from a judgment of the Kennebec County Probate Court (*E. Mitchell, J.*) adjudicating her incapacitated and appointing a public guardian.¹ The court found by clear and convincing evidence that Starr was incapacitated and required a guardian “as a means of providing continuing care and supervision” pursuant to 18-A M.R.S. § 5-304(b) (2016). The court’s findings are supported by competent evidence in the record. *See Estate of Bragdon*, 2005 ME 85, ¶¶ 5-6, 14, 875 A.2d 697.
