MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

R. appeals from a judgment of the Cumberland County Probate Court (*Aranson, J.*) denying his petition to terminate a limited guardianship that provided his guardian with authority over his medical and mental health treatment. Contrary to R.'s contentions, the record contains sufficient competent evidence to support the court's findings, by clear and convincing evidence, that the statutory requirements for an adult guardianship as set forth in 18-C M.R.S. § 5-301 (2022) exist. *See* 18-C M.R.S. § 5-319 (2022); *Adult Guardianship & Conservatorship of T.*, 2022 ME 51, ¶ 13, 284 A.3d 83; *Guardianship of Hailey M.*, 2016 ME 80, ¶ 15, 140 A.3d 478.
