MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

The parents appeal from an order of the District Court (Waterville, *Gilbert, J.*) terminating their parental rights as to their two children pursuant to 22 M.R.S. § 4055(1)(B)(2)(a), (b)(i) (2024). The parents argue that the court's findings regarding parental unfitness were not supported by clear and convincing evidence¹ in the record and that the court's conclusion that termination of parental rights was in the children's best interests constituted an abuse of discretion.² Contrary to the parents' contentions, there was clear and convincing evidence in the record to support the court's findings, and the court properly exercised its discretion. *See In re Child of Louise G.*, 2020 ME 87, ¶ 8, 236 A.3d 445.

¹ The father also argues that his due process rights were violated, but the State correctly contends that his due process argument appears to actually be a sufficiency of the evidence argument because of its focus on a lack of clear and convincing evidence.

² Additionally, both parents argue that the Department failed to make a good faith effort to help the parents reunify with the children. The Department's reunification efforts, however, were more than sufficient. Further, "[t]he Department's compliance with its rehabilitation and reunification duties as outlined in section 4041 does not constitute a discrete element requiring proof in termination proceedings." *In re Hannah S.*, 2016 ME 32, ¶ 12, 133 A.3d 590.
