## MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

The father appeals from the District Court's (Augusta, *Bristol, J.*) order terminating his parental rights. Contrary to the father's contention, the court did not err in finding parental unfitness.<sup>1</sup> *See* 22 M.R.S. § 4055(1)(B)(2)(b)(i)-(ii) (2025). The record shows that the father has not engaged in the services necessary to alleviate jeopardy, has not engaged with the child's providers, and has not demonstrated an understanding of the child's complex needs and how he may meet those needs. Furthermore, the father lacks the required safe and stable housing for reunification.

The trial court also did not abuse its discretion in determining that termination, as opposed to a permanency guardianship, was in the best interest of the child, who, at the time of termination had been in the Department's custody for over two and a half years. The child has been in the grandparent's care for her entire life, "and the creation of a permanency guardianship would leave the shadow of future legal proceedings at a time when the child needs a

stable, permanent home." In re Child of Domenick B., 2018 ME 158,  $\P$  10, 197 A.3d 1076.
