MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Milo Haney appeals his convictions for making a material misstatement of fact in violation of 29-A M.R.S.A. § 2103 (1996 & Supp. 1999); possessing a motor vehicle with altered identification marks in violation of 29-A M.R.S.A. § 2105 (1996); criminal simulation in violation of 17-A M.R.S.A. § 705 (1983); intentional evasion of excise tax in violation of 36 M.R.S.A. § 184-A (Supp. 1999); and criminal sales tax fraud in violation of 36 M.R.S.A. § 2113 (1990 & Supp. 1999) entered in the Superior Court (Aroostook County, *Kravchuk, J.*) after a jury trial. Contrary to Haney's contentions that the evidence was insufficient to convict him, viewing the evidence in the light most favorable to the State, a jury rationally could have found Haney guilty beyond a reasonable doubt on all counts. *See State v. Young*, 1998 ME 107, ¶ 9, 711 A.2d 134, 135-36.
