MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Daniel O'Shea appeals from a judgment entered in the District Court (Bangor, *Murray, J.*) finding him guilty of operating a vehicle while under the influence of intoxicants pursuant to 29-A M.R.S.A. § 2411 (1996 & Supp. 2001). Contrary to O'Shea's contentions, the District Court could have rationally concluded beyond a reasonable doubt that he was under the influence of intoxicants, *State v. Deschenes*, 2001 ME 136, ¶ 6, 780 A.2d 295, 297, and that he was sufficiently informed of the consequences of refusing to submit to an intoxilyzer test as required by 29-A M.R.S.A. § 2521 (1996 & Supp. 2001).
