MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Roland Pouliot appeals from a judgment entered in the Superior Court (Washington County, *Marden, J.*) following a jury trial finding him guilty of possession of a firearm by a felon (Class C), 15 M.R.S.A. § 393(1)(A) (Supp. 2001). Contrary to Pouliot's contentions, (1) the Superior Court, on the facts of this case, did not commit error by declining to hold a pretrial hearing to dismiss the State's indictment, *State v. Storer*, 583 A.2d 1016, 1020 (Me. 1990); (2) there was sufficient evidence, in totality, to convict him on the State's possession of a firearm by a felon charge, *State v. Hanson*, 331 A.2d 375, 376 (Me. 1975); *see* M.R. Crim. P. 29(a); and (3) no error was committed by excluding the testimony of State Trooper Paul White, M.R. Evid. 802.
