MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Kristielynne P. Cutler appeals from the judgment of the District Court (Bridgton, *Eggert, J.*), finding that she had committed the civil violation of speeding, fifty-five miles-per-hour in a thirty-mile-per-hour zone, in violation of 29-A M.R.S.A. § 2073(3) (1996). On appeal, Cutler contends that the State's witness's memory was flawed and that there were defects in the evidence such that she should not have been found to have committed the offense. The proceeding was not recorded. Accordingly, there is no transcript by which Cutler's claims may be evaluated. Based on the available record, there is no indication that the

trial court committed any error of law or abused its discretion in reaching its judgment. *See State v. Nugent*, 2002 ME 111, ¶ 2, 801 A.2d 1001, 1002.
