MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

John R. French appeals from the judgment entered in the Superior Court (Kennebec County, *Marden, J.*) affirming the decision of the Maine Unemployment Insurance Commission disqualifying him from the receipt of unemployment benefits upon finding that he was discharged from his employment for misconduct. *See* 26 M.R.S.A. § 1043(23) (Supp. 2003). Contrary to French's contention, the evidence before the Commission was sufficient to support its finding. *Sprague Elec. Co. v. Unemployment Ins. Comm'n*, 544 A.2d 728, 732 (Me. 1988) (stating "The Commission's finding will be upheld if there is

competent evidence to support it, notwithstanding inconsistent evidence in the record.”).
