MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Builders Resource Development Corporation (BRDC) appeals from a judgment of the Superior Court (Androscoggin County, *Delahanty, J.*) affirming orders by the Lewiston City Council condemning properties BRDC owns in Lewiston. *See* 17 M.R.S. § 2851 (2006). Contrary to BRDC's arguments, the City Council's orders were supported by substantial evidence in the record, *see Forbes v. Town of Southwest Harbor*, 2001 ME 9, ¶ 6, 763 A.2d 1183, 1186; the City Council's orders did not constitute violations of BRDC's rights to equal protection and due process, *see Quiland, Inc. v. Wells Sanitary Dist.*, 2006 ME 113, ¶¶ 15-16, 905 A.2d 806, 810; *Kittery Retail Ventures, LLC v. Town of Kittery*, 2004 ME 65, ¶ 32, 856 A.2d 1183, 1193; *State v. Dhuy*, 2003 ME 75, ¶¶ 16-17, 825 A.2d 336, 343; and the City Council's statutory exercise of its powers of condemnation did

not constitute an unjust taking, see Kirkpatrick v. City of Bangor, 1999 ME 73, ¶ 11, 728 A.2d 1268, 1271; Seven Islands Land Co. v. Me. Land Use Regulation Comm'n, 450 A.2d 475, 482 (Me. 1982).

The court did not abuse its discretion in denying BRDC's motions for trial of the facts without a hearing because BRDC failed to make prima facie showings in its offers of proof that a hearing and trial were necessary. *See* M.R. Civ. P. 80B(d); *Baker's Table, Inc. v. City of Portland*, 2000 ME 7, ¶ 9, 743 A.2d 237, 240-41; *Boisvert v. King*, 618 A.2d 211, 214 n.6 (Me. 1992); *cf. Trimble v. Comm'r, Dep't of Human Servs.*, 635 A.2d 937, 938 (Me. 1993) (reviewing the denial of a Rule 80C(e) motion for abuse of discretion).
