MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Jasmine L. Soucie appeals from a judgment of conviction entered in the Superior Court (Penobscot County, *Jabar, J.*) following a jury trial for assault (Class D), 17-A M.R.S. § 207(1)(A) (2006). Soucie contends that the trial court erred in admitting out of court statements she made to the arresting officers, claiming the statements were covered by a suppression order that excluded all statements she made after she was told that she could not leave, and that her trial counsel was ineffective. Contrary to Soucie's contentions, the record on appeal does not establish that the statements the officers testified to at trial were prohibited by the suppression order. *See Ginn v. Kelley Pontiac-Mazda*, 2004 ME 1, ¶ 15, 841 A.2d 785, 788-89. We do

not address Soucie's claim of ineffective assistance of counsel because such a claim may not be presented on direct appeal. *State v. Nichols*, 1997 ME 178, ¶ 4, 698 A.2d 521, 522.
