MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Robert W. Tibbetts Jr. appeals from a judgment of the Superior Court (Kennebec, *Marden, J.*) finding him to be in violation of a prior consent decree and ordering that he pay civil penalties, be subject to injunctive relief, and pay restitution arising from his engaging in improper wood-cutting practices in violation of the consent decree. Contrary to Tibbetts's contentions, the record fully supports the court's findings regarding violation of the consent decree, and the monetary and restitution relief ordered by the court was within the range of relief

that the court could properly order in its discretion. *See Dep't of Env'tl. Prot. v. Emerson*, 563 A.2d 762, 767-71 (Me. 1989).
