MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Matthew C. Haney appeals from a judgment of the District Court (Caribou, *Griffiths, J.*) convicting him of criminal mischief (Class D), 17-A M.R.S. § 806(1)(A) (2006), following a nonjury trial. Contrary to Haney's contentions, the court could rely on circumstantial evidence in reaching its verdict, and the evidence was sufficient for the court to find Haney guilty of each element of the charge of criminal mischief. *See State v. Willette*, 2002 ME 165, ¶ 7, 809 A.2d 617, 620.
