MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

David Boucher appeals from a judgment entered in the District Court (Farmington, *McElwee*, *J*.) awarding Discover Bank \$11,747.35 plus pre- and post-judgment interest and costs. Boucher contends that there is insufficient evidence to conclude that he had formed a valid contract with Discover Bank. Contrary to Boucher's contentions, there is competent evidence to conclude that a contract between the parties was created when Boucher accepted the terms of Discover's cardmember agreement by using his credit card for purchases. *See VanVoorhees v. Dodge*, 679 A.2d 1077, 1080 (Me. 1996).
