#### MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Randal S. Horr appeals from a post-judgment order entered in the Superior Court (Cumberland County, *Humphrey*, *C.J.*) denying Horr's request for the names and addresses of the jurors in Horr's 2002 trial in which he was convicted of theft and several motor vehicle offenses.<sup>1</sup> Those convictions were affirmed. *State v. Horr*, 2003 ME 110, 831 A.2d 407. Contrary to his contentions, the court did not abuse its discretion in determining that it was not in the interests of justice to

Horr also appears to appeal from an order granting his request for certain information pertaining to his sentencing (*Delahanty*, *J*.). Because the court granted his request and ordered that copies of the sentencing materials be provided to Horr, his only appeal on this issue appears to be that he did not actually get the copies. We suggest that this matter is best resolved by the clerk's office resending the copies ordered by the court to Horr at his address at the Maine State Prison.
