MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Jake D. DeFilippo appeals from a judgment of conviction entered in the Superior Court (Hancock County, *Jabar, J.*) after a jury trial for unlawful trafficking in a scheduled drug (Class B), 17-A M.R.S. § 1103(1-A), (A) (2006). Contrary to DeFilippo's arguments, (1) the trial court did not abuse its discretion when it denied his motion in limine to introduce evidence of a witness's prior convictions from 1988 and 1989, *see* M.R. Evid. 609(a), (b); *State v. Hanscome*, 459 A.2d 569, 572 (Me. 1983); *cf. State v. DiPietro*, 420 A.2d 1233, 1235 (Me. 1980); (2) the trial court did not err in giving the jury instruction regarding accomplice liability, *State v. Martin*, 2007 ME 23, ¶¶ 5-6, 916 A.2d 961, 964; and

(3) the evidence presented at trial was sufficient to support the jury's finding beyond a reasonable doubt that DeFilippo was guilty of the crime charged, *State v. Smen*, 2006 ME 40, ¶ 7, 895 A.2d 319, 321.
