MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Ben M. Lyons appeals from the judgment of the District Court (Machias, *Romei, J.*) convicting him of scallop fishing in a closed area (Class D) in violation of 12 M.R.S. § 6722 (2007). On appeal, Lyons asserts that the evidence was insufficient to convict him of the charge. Review of the record demonstrates that the evidence, including circumstantial evidence, was more than sufficient to support the court's finding, beyond a reasonable doubt, that the crime was committed. *See State v. Smen*, 2006 ME 40, ¶ 7, 895 A.2d 319, 321; *State v. Stinson*, 2000 ME 87, ¶ 8, 751 A.2d 1011, 1014.
