MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

William D. Neily appeals from a judgment entered in the Superior Court (Cumberland County, *Crowley, J.*) in favor of the Office of the State Controller and the State of Maine on his action for unpaid wages brought pursuant to 26 M.R.S. § 626 (2007). Contrary to Neily's contentions, legislation funding a collective bargaining agreement between the State and the Maine State Employees Association/Service Employees International Union Local 1989 does not require the State to perform a market pay analysis for Neily's position, which was created after the parties entered into the agreement. *See* P.L. 2001, ch. 438, §§ A-1, A-6 (effective June 20, 2001). In addition, we discern no deprivation of Neily's right to equal protection of the law under the Maine and United States Constitutions. *See Nugent v. Town of Camden*, 1998 ME 92, ¶¶ 15-17, 710 A.2d 245, 249.
