MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Jacob Chambers appeals from the judgment of the Superior Court (Aroostook County, *Hunter, J.*) convicting him, after a jury-waived trial, of operating after suspension, 29-A M.R.S. § 2412-A(1-A) (2007). Chambers contends that the Superior Court erred at trial in believing the State's witness, a private citizen, and not believing his several witnesses who testified that someone else, and not Chambers, was operating the ATV. Because credibility determinations are for the court and there is sufficient evidence in the record to support the court's findings that, at the time in question, Chambers was operating a motor vehicle on a public way and his right to operate was suspended, the conviction must be affirmed. *See State v. Moores*, 2006 ME 139, ¶¶ 7-9, 910 A.2d 373, 375-76.
