MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Kenneth Knox appeals from a judgment entered in the Superior Court (Kennebec County, *Mills*, *J*.) convicting him of one count each of arson (Class A), 17-A M.R.S. § 802(1)(B)(2) (2007), attempted murder (Class A), 17-A M.R.S. §§ 152(1)(A), 201 (2007), criminal threatening (Class C), 17-A M.R.S. §§ 209(1), 1252(4) (2007), and aggravated cruelty to animals (Class C), 17 M.R.S. § 1031(1-B) (2007). He argues that there was insufficient evidence to support a finding that he committed attempted murder.

Contrary to Knox's arguments, there was sufficient evidence in the record to establish beyond a reasonable doubt that Knox acted with the necessary culpable state of mind to commit attempted murder. *See State v. Pierce*, 2006 ME 75, ¶ 16, 899 A.2d 801, 804.
