MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

The father of James D. II appeals from a judgment entered in the District Court (West Bath, *Tucker*, *J.*) terminating his parental rights to James pursuant to 22 M.R.S. § 4055 (2008). Despite the father's efforts towards rehabilitation and reunification with James, there is clear and convincing evidence in the record to support the court's findings that: (1) the father is unable to protect James from jeopardy and these circumstances are unlikely to change within a time reasonably calculated to meet the child's needs; (2) the father is unable to take responsibility for James within a time reasonably calculated to meet the child's needs; and (3) the father failed to rebut the presumption of unfitness for having a chronic substance abuse problem. See 22 M.R.S. § 4055. Having first found parental unfitness, the court did not abuse its discretion in addressing the importance of establishing permanency for James in its best interest analysis. See In re Thomas H., 2005 ME 123, ¶¶ 29-30, 889 A.2d 297, 307-08. Finally, contrary to the father's contentions, the court was not required to find that the Department's reunification efforts were reasonable before terminating his parental rights, see In re Doris G., 2006 ME 142, ¶¶ 16-17, 912 A.2d 572, 578, and the termination proceeding did not violate his due process rights, see In re Austin T., 2006 ME 28, ¶ 11, 898 A.2d 946, 950 (providing that, in the termination of parental rights context, due process requires service and notice, a hearing, and the clear and convincing burden of proof).
