MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Jeffrey Phillips appeals from the judgment of the Violations Bureau (Portland, *Beaudoin*, *J.*) finding him to have committed the civil violation of speeding in violation of 29-A M.R.S. § 2073(3) (2008) and imposing a \$400 fine. On appeal, Phillips principally contends that the fine amount was excessive and based on inaccurate information about his prior driving record. Review of the record indicates that the fine imposed, while higher than the Violations Bureau schedule, was within the range of fines which the court could impose after trial, as a matter of discretion, particularly considering the violations that appeared on Phillips's driving record within the ten-year-look-back period sometimes applied in considering sentencing in motor vehicle violation cases.
