MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Donald Dobson appeals from a judgment, entered in the Superior Court (Cumberland County, *Cole, J*), granting the motion to dismiss filed by Ardith Keef, William Keef, and the Anchor Missionary Fellowship. Dobson alleges that the Keefs and the Fellowship invaded his privacy by burying a listening device on the side of a road, near the Fellowship, where he and others protested the Fellowship. Contrary to Dobson's contentions, he has not stated a claim for invasion of privacy through intrusion upon seclusion because he has not physically occupied any premises privately for purposes of seclusion. *See Champagne v. Mid-Maine Med. Ctr.*, 1998 ME 87, ¶ 18, 711 A.2d 842, 848; *Nelson v. Maine Times*, 373 A.2d 1221, 1223 (Me. 1977).

We deny the Keefs' and the Fellowship's request to impose sanctions against Dobson pursuant to M.R. App. P. 13(f).
