MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Rino Ouellette appeals from the judgment of the Violations Bureau (Presque Isle, *O'Mara, J.*) finding him to have committed the civil violation of speeding twenty-five miles per hour over the limit in violation of 29-A M.R.S. § 2073(3) (2008). Although there is no transcript of the proceedings, Ouellette contends that the Ashland officer who stopped him must have fabricated the radar reading indicating that he was going seventy-five miles per hour in a fifty mile-per-hour zone. He bases this assertion on his view that his radar detector was turned on but did not warn him that the officer had radar working. The matter is purely a credibility question, and without a transcript we must infer that the record fully supports the trial court's fact-findings. *State v. Hughes*, 2004 ME 141, ¶ 7, 863 A.2d 266, 269.
