MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

William Tardif appeals from the judgment of the Superior Court (Kennebec County, *Mills, J.*) dismissing, for lack of subject matter jurisdiction, his 2007 appeal of a 2005 DHHS order that he pay past due child support. Because Tardif's appeal pursuant to M.R. Civ. P. 80C was filed many months after his 2006 receipt of notice of the DHHS action he sought to appeal, the Superior Court properly determined that it lacked subject matter jurisdiction of the action because the appeal was not timely filed. M.R. Civ. P. 80C(b). *See Thomas v. BFC Marine/Bath Fuel Co.*, 2004 ME 27, ¶ 5, 843 A.2d 3, 5.
