MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

Denis G. Nadeau appeals from the judgment of the District Court (Dover-Foxcroft, *Stitham, J.*) finding him guilty, after a nonjury trial, of theft by unauthorized taking (Class E), 17-A M.R.S. § 353(1)(A) (2009), and criminal trespass (Class E), 17-A M.R.S. § 402(1)(C) (2009). Nadeau contends that the evidence is insufficient to support the conviction, that he was not allowed to fully present his defenses, that the court allowed improper expert testimony, and that the court relied on evidence that had been tampered with. The record, reviewed most favorably to the State, fully supports the court's findings of guilt. *See State v. Milliken*, 2010 ME 1, ¶ 19, 985 A.2d 1152, 1158. The record also does not indicate occurrence of the procedural improprieties asserted by Nadeau in his brief. *See In re Anthony R.*, 2010 ME 4, ¶ 8, 987 A.2d 532, 534 (to properly preserve an issue for review, the issue or objection must first be presented in the trial court). In this case, the court committed no error and conducted the proceedings properly.
